
# SNEH Community Pre Schools during Covid

### The Journey with SNEH

### Sanskar Santosh Bukttar



Sanskar Santosh Bukttar, smart and hardworking 3 years old boy lives in Ajanthanagar community in PCMC, Pune. His family migrated from Latur district in Maharashtra. Santosh, his father is not educated enough to get a permanent job, so he works as a daily wage worker. His Mother Kastura is a home maker. With intent to provide quality education for their son, his parents borrowed money from neighbours and enrolled him in nearby school. But during pandemic Santosh lost his source of income and Sanskar could not continue his education. During our Survey for new admissions at SNEH Community Preschools in Ajanthanagar, our teachers counselled his parents. His family received groceries during our Covid relief grocery distribution. Sanskar resumed his schooling with Ajanthanagar SNEH Community Preschool in Nursery class. Our teachers trained Sanskar and his mother to attend online schooling. Our Awareness sessions on various topics including Nutrition, Parenting, and Family planning helped Kastura and family to prioritize their spending. Now, Sanskar's parents are happy to see him attend school enthusiastically and learn new things every day. Watching him learn and speak English makes them happier! Sanskar's family is grateful for help and guidance provided by SNEH.

# Bravery is finding a way through turbulent times!

Shaurya Krishna Patil, smart and enthusiastic 4 years old boy lives in a rented accommodation in Kalewadi community PCMC, Pune. His family is migrated from Vidarbha region in Maharashtra. Krishna, his father is not educated enough to get a permanent job and his Mother Kavita is a homemaker. Shaurya lives in a joint family along with his parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles. His father is the only breadwinner in the family of 11 people. With intent to provide quality education for their son and cover household expenses, Krishna used to workday and night to financially support his dependents. Everything was going well until the pandemic hit in early 2020. Shaurya's father lost his job and family had to move back to their native place as there was no source of income. To make a fresh start, Krishna returned to Pune after 10 months in search of a job and better education for his son leaving behind his family at his native place. During our Survey, SNEH staff met Krishna and assisted him to enroll Shaurya to SNEH Community Preschools Kalewadi branch. Our staff also helped him and his other family members to locate nearby jobs. After finding a satisfactory job, family is united again and living together in Pune with Krishna. Shaurya also joined our Nursery online classes. Initially he was very shy and had concentration problems. Our Kalewadi teachers put in extra efforts to improve his concentration and social skills. True to his name, now Shaurya (Bravery in English) handles every situation very well. Now with improved confidence in Jr.kg class, he eagerly participates in all class activities and has improved immensely in academics as well. Shaurya's parents are happy to see him attend school enthusiastically and learn new things every day. Shaurya's family is grateful for help and guidance provided by SNEH.



# The Harder the struggle, the more glorious the triumph!

Life was never a Bed of Roses for Sangharsh Kamble, a young, energetic kid from Shirur, Osmanabad in Maharashtra, who was enrolled with us in the Kalewadi Pre School. True to his name, Sangharsh (Struggle in English) endured a lot of adversities and struggles — starting with the tragic death of his father a few years back in a road accident, post which his mother had to single-handedly raise him and his two sisters.

Studied till 8th standard and working as a domestic help, Vanita (Shangharsh's mother) continued to dream about a brighter future for her kids. Her job loss during the pandemic and a severe bout of jaundice ate up all her savings, almost compelled her to pull her kids out of school. However, our SNEH Community Pre School staff counselled her and assisted her to secure another job to tide over this crisis – bruised but incredibly toughened!! Sangharsh, having seen this all, focused hard on his studies and never let these difficulties get the better of him or his cheer and joyful nature. Not only did he, get well versed with the online mode of education, but also picked up English rather quickly to the extent that he developed a liking towards poetry, which he wishes to pursue as a hobby.

Our staff assisted him to get enrolled in the SNBP International School, under the RTE program, wherein his school fees wouldn't bother Vanita any longer. Sangharsh also benefitted from the RTE support classes, which our Pre-school staff conducts to help our passing-out students to get integrated with the Primary school curriculum.

Despite all the hardships till date, Vanita continues to bear a positive attitude towards life and is committed to educate her kids and carve out a better future for them.



# Tough times never last, but tough people do!

SNEH staff met Abhimanyu Navgite, 5 years old boy during SNEH Community Preschools survey for admissions. He lives with his parents and grandparents in Wakad area, Pune. The family is migrated from Paithan district in Aurangabad to Pune 6 years back for better livelihood opportunities. Rahul, his father is not educated enough to secure a stable job. Currently he is working in a hardware shop near Kalewadi Phata, Pune, while Mother Ashwini is a Homemaker. Abhimanyu's joint family fully depends on Rahul's earning and they are suffering hardships due to poor financial conditions. Abhimanyu joined SNEH Community Preschools in junior kg during pandemic. He had no friends and was very shy. Our teachers counselled his family about importance of attending school in the early years. True to his name 'Abhimanyu', his never giving up attitude helps him to accomplish tasks given by our teachers. He attends classes regularly and participates in all activities very enthusiastically. The Couple is also expecting their 2nd child soon. There are some medical complications observed in baby's kidney development and the couple is unable to manage the treatment costs. SNEH staffs along with our panel of doctors are helping Abhimanyu's family in this tough situation. Abhimanyu's parents are very grateful for timely guidance by SNEH team in difficult days. They are happy to see overall progress in Abhimanyu. With the help from SNEH team, they hope to welcome a healthy baby soon!



# SNEH RTE Support classes A Sustainable approach

SNEH Community Preschools run free RTE support classes for our former students. We have over 60 students from grade 1 to grade 5 taking daily classes with close to 20 volunteers under supervision of Ms. Suchita, with the student-teacher ratio being 8:1. The classes are spanned over the entire week. The core subjects like Mathematics, English, EVS are taught from Monday to Thursday, and Friday being the Art and Craft class.

### **Project Scope**

To respond to the global, and more importantly the national need for `Addressing Malnutrition' through Preventative and Curative intervention plan is the main purpose of the project.

To break the vicious cycle of malnutrition, an important intervention needs to be planned. SNEH Foundation along with Tata Motors, according to the baseline survey, has worked on three target communities from Pimpri-Chinchwad, Pune: Ota Scheme, Kasarwadi and Bhatnagar for one year.

### Overview of the Project COMAL

SNEH is working on a Community-based Management of Acute Malnutrition (CMAM) intervention in urban slums of Pune and PCMC in collaboration with Tata Motors (CSR), Pune and Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS)

#### **Welfare Workers**

Project Manager, CLWs/Balakmitras (Community Link Workers), Interns and group of volunteers provide mediation for children with Acute Malnutrition

#### Nutrition

Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Foods (RUTF) or Ready-to-Use Supplementary Foods (RUSF) accompanied by Iron, Calcium and Vitamin B supplementation

#### Viability of the project

Frequent and constant medical monitoring by doctors and robust awareness programs





### Qualitative Observations about Change in knowledge, attitudes and Practices

People in the community were initially found to be ignorant and oblivious of an array of subjects, including technological awareness, government policies, addiction awareness, and, most importantly, the COVID-19 scenario and preventive measures.

SNEH carried out interventions in three stages to increase awareness among these people. As per the area wise analysis, Ota scheme 3 had the most knowledge of the issues mentioned, whilst Bhatnagar indicated the least cognizance about the same.

The results indicate a gradual rise in knowledge, attitudes, and practices about all of the topics in all of the domains. There has been a significant and positive improvement in areas where people were previously ignorant about subjects like addiction, vaccination, virtual sessions, WASH practices, breastfeeding, nutrition and food, government policies, and family planning, to name a few.











### **COVID 19 Vaccination Initiative by TATA Motors**

A COVID 19 vaccine is intended to provide acquired immunity against COVID 19 disease. But the community residents are not aware of the registration process and some of them also seem to be scared to visit the healthcare center for immunization. The Tata Motors has initiated a COVID 19 vaccination initiative with the help of PCMC and associated NGOs including SNEH Foundation. About 15 people from Pawna Nagar were vaccinated against COVID 19 from SNEH Foundation's reference. In the background of the COVID 19 outbreak, the Tata Motors team has done great management. The vaccination centers were well-kempt; well managed and proper guidance was given to the beneficiaries according to the need.



### **Grocery Distribution in the communities**

The COVID- 19 pandemic has become a major concern for the entire world, and it causes damage to society either in a mental, physical, or in an economic way. Due to the COVID-19 outbreak and the subsequent lockdown, the problem of the daily wage workers has started to rise day by day. It also results in unemployment of these daily wage workers. Due to this, it becomes very difficult for them to feed their families. So, by considering such struggling times, SNEH foundation with the help of its well-wishers took an initiative by realizing the need of the needy in a time of privation and distributed the basic grocery items to around 15 families. We are in a continuous process of providing the basic grocery material to the needy. Our team members took the risk to reach out to the needy and distributed the grocery by taking utmost care so that the social that social distancing is maintained as per the Govt. orders.

# Session on Family planning and contraceptives in collaboration with FPAI

The COVID 19 cases are rising on daily basis. It observed during the research data that, there is a chance that, the pregnancy rate may increase during this pandemic period. And by considering the need, we organized a virtual awareness session for our beneficiaries on family planning and types of contraception to create awareness among the beneficiaries. The session was organized in collaboration with Family planning association of India. The speaker for the session was Ms. Kirti Lohar (Assistant Project Coordinator). About 70 beneficiaries joined the session. The session was very interactive.





### **World Population Day**

World Population Day is observed every year on July 11. The main purpose of this day is to draw attention to the issues arising out of the rising population across the globe. India has the world's second largest populace after China. It is necessary to highlight the difficulties created by overpopulation and raising awareness about how overpopulation may harm the ecosystem and the progress of humanity. By considering the situation, Under COMAL project we have conducted an awareness session at ground level and have guided the beneficiaries about the importance of small family and birth spacing. We have also guided them about various contraceptive methods. We have distributed the condoms to the beneficiaries at Ajinthanagar to ensure the adequate birth spacing and to avoid unwanted pregnancy. We received a good response from the beneficiaries.





### **Celebration of World Breast-feeding week**

On the occasion of World Breastfeeding week, we have initiated a program called 'Annaprashan day' at ground level under project Combating Malnutrition. Annaprashan (Weaning) is done when the baby is ready to make the transition from breast milk to weaning foods at about 6 months of age. It's commonly known as your baby's first feed and it is performed after 6 months of the baby's age. On this occasion, we have introduced the babies with healthy semiliquid food items like ragi kheer, daal rice etc. Along with that, we have distributed weaning kits along with a piggy bank to promote the idea of saving and making the beneficiaries aware about using the collected money for child's nutritional needs.








### Menstruation Session for the Adolescent Girls by Hamjoli Foundation

In India even mere mention of the menstruation topic has been a taboo in the past and even to this date the cultural and social influences appear to be a hurdle for advancement of knowledge on the subject. To address this issue SNEH Foundation and TML project team have conducted a session in collaboration in association with Humjoli Foundation for the adolescent girls at Ota Scheme slum. The speaker for the session was Dr. Saniya Siddique, founder of Humjoli Foundation. She very well explained the concept of periods to the girls. The girls were made aware of menstrual hygiene. Brief information about Menstrual Cups, Cotton, Cloth Sanitary Reusable Napkins and Tampons were distributed among the beneficiaries. A story book based on Periods and its facts were given to the girls. The girls were also given awareness about the cervical cancer and its precautions. 30 adolescent girls were present for the session. We received an amazing response from the beneficiaries.









### **Oral Presentation at International Nutrition Research Conference 2021**

Magnus group had organized an international nutrition conference on 9th to 11th September 2021. Presentors from across the globe had participated in this one of its kind research conference. SNEH Foundation and Tata motors presented an oral paper about Project Combating malnutrition and the findings from the years 2014 to 2020 during the oral presentation. Ms. Shraddha also moderated the conference on 9th Sept 2021.

# Qualitative Learning & observations

Many beneficiaries have opted for contraceptive methods. Due to reduction is children's physical activity post COVID, weight gain, hunger etc seems to have negatively impacted

Many beneficiaries have started to consume the healthy food and reduced the junk food consumption

We have started the home-made SF food and through that the weight gain of the child is assessed

Linked the government schemes like sukanys samruddhi Yojana and benefited the beneficiaries from the same

ICDS workers and supervisors have expressed that our project has enhanced their work and have benefited with the entire community. Our knowledge about the subject is something that they didn't have and are now motivated to work together

Due to COVID 19, many beneficiaries have lost the job and many female have started out for job. However, there is no difference in the child weight loss

An increased awareness among the parents regarding the child's nutrition as well as positive change in eating habits of children due to counseling done by our team has been noted

Ms Z (consent for sharing the name was not given by the beneficiary), is a resident from Kasarwadi, Pimpri Chinchwad. Her child has participated in the project as a child with SAM. Her mother is 28 yrs old. She has 4 daughters and 1 son. Her husband is a fruit seller. In the past, she has consumed abortion pills from the pharmacy and have aborted the child 3 times. Her husband was denying to opt for any contraceptive measures. Due to this, she had conceived again, and she was in 1.5 months of gestation when our team found out. Her Hemoglobin level dropped, and she also had weakness and dizziness. Rigorous counselling was done by the project manager and CLWs regarding family planning. Also, with the help of the SNEH Foundation, we have given financial aid to the beneficiary for USG. Once it was done the case was referred to the government hospital. She aborted the child and underwent a Tubectomy. She is happy to receive help from the COMAL team and acknowledged the efforts taken by the CLWs project managers.






### **Total No. Of Beneficiaries (856)**




### MENTAL HEALTH DAY CELEBRATION

The COVID 19 Pandemic has had a major impact on people's mental health. Some groups, including health and other frontline workers, students, people living alone, and those with pre-existing mental health conditions, have been particularly, affected. October 10 is celebrated as **World mental Health Day**. The theme for this year was "Mental Health in an Unequal World". SNEH Foundation conducted a virtual zoom session by Dr. Bhooshan Shukla, a very well-known Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist, to interact with the beneficiaries regarding Child Mental Health. About 133 parents attended the session where Dr Shukla talked to the parents about child mental health with a focus on molding behavior, the impact of the domestic environment and parent behavior on children, developing healthy habits with regards to food, studying, thinking etc. vaccination, working on unhealthy habits, screen time, developing kids who can think and have their own opinions, and a lot of other topics. Parents were inquisitive and Dr Shukla clarified all the queries from the parents with the utmost scientific yet simple explanation.












# GLOBAL HAND WASH DAY CELEBRATION

October 15 is Global Handwashing Day, a global advocacy to increasing awareness and understanding about the importance of handwashing with soap as an effective and affordable way to prevent diseases and save lives. This year's theme, "Our Future is at Hand- Let's Move Forward Together", calls for coordinated action as we actively work toward universal hand hygiene. It is observed at ground level, that beneficiaries are quite ignorant about basic hand hygiene practices. To increase the awareness, we conducted various awareness activities at Bhat Nagar, Indira Nagar and Ajinthanagar. We guided the beneficiaries regarding hand wash techniques, its importance, frequency of hand wash and its benefits for a healthy lifestyle. Along with that, we distributed the hand sanitizers to the beneficiaries.

### VIRTUAL SESSION ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE BY ASHA NGO



In Collaboration with ASHA NGO, SNEH Foundation organized a virtual awareness session on Domestic violence. The Speaker for the session was Dr. Mukta Kale. The session highlighted various topics like types of domestic violence, reasons why females don't feel like speaking up about it, the cycle of violence, helpline numbers, ASHA NGO's work process to deal with domestic violence cases, interventions available, who can avail the services etc. Along with that, speaker has shared some personal experiences and the cases that the NGO has dealt with to understand the detail prospective, and the interventions can be provided for those ones.

### CELEBRATION OF WORLD AIDS DAY

**World AIDS Day** is celebrated on December 1<sup>st</sup> every year, dedicated to raise awareness, educate and empower the understanding of HIV as a global public health problem. The theme for World AIDS Day 2021 was End inequalities. End AIDS. End **Pandemic.** The day focuses on increasing inequalities & inequalities in access to healthcare services for HIV due to COVID 19. By considering the background, SNEH Foundation conducted a virtual awareness session for the beneficiaries. The session was conducted by Dr. Ashwini Desphande, Medical Officer, from Manavya NGO, whose work is mainly with regards to the people living with AIDS & HIV. During the session, the speaker Addressed the subject like, HIV stigma, preventive measures to avoid the HIV or AIDS and many factors related to the same. About 108 beneficiaries had attended the session along with the SNEH staff and ICDS workers.


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
